Plants like spider plants, peace lilies, and snake plants are known for their air-filtering capabilities and are easy to maintain.
- II. Contrary to the belief that all plants require constant sunlight, many indoor plants thrive in low- light conditions. Overexposure to sunlight can even damage some houseplants. This makes them ideal for urban homes and offices where natural light may be limited. Additionally, caring for plants can have psychological benefits. It has been observed that tending to plants can reduce stress, lower blood pressure, and improve mood.
- III. While it's commonly assumed that more water is better for plant growth, overwatering is one of the leading causes of plant death. Each species has its own watering needs. For example, succulents like aloe vera require minimal water and are better suited for dry conditions. It is essential to understand the specific care requirements of each plant to ensure healthy growth.
- IV. Some people argue that artificial plants are a better option since they require no care. However, they do not provide the same air-purifying or psychological benefits as real plants. Research suggests that even just the presence of living greenery can boost concentration and productivity in workspaces. Therefore, real plants are not only decorative but also functional in enhancing well-being.

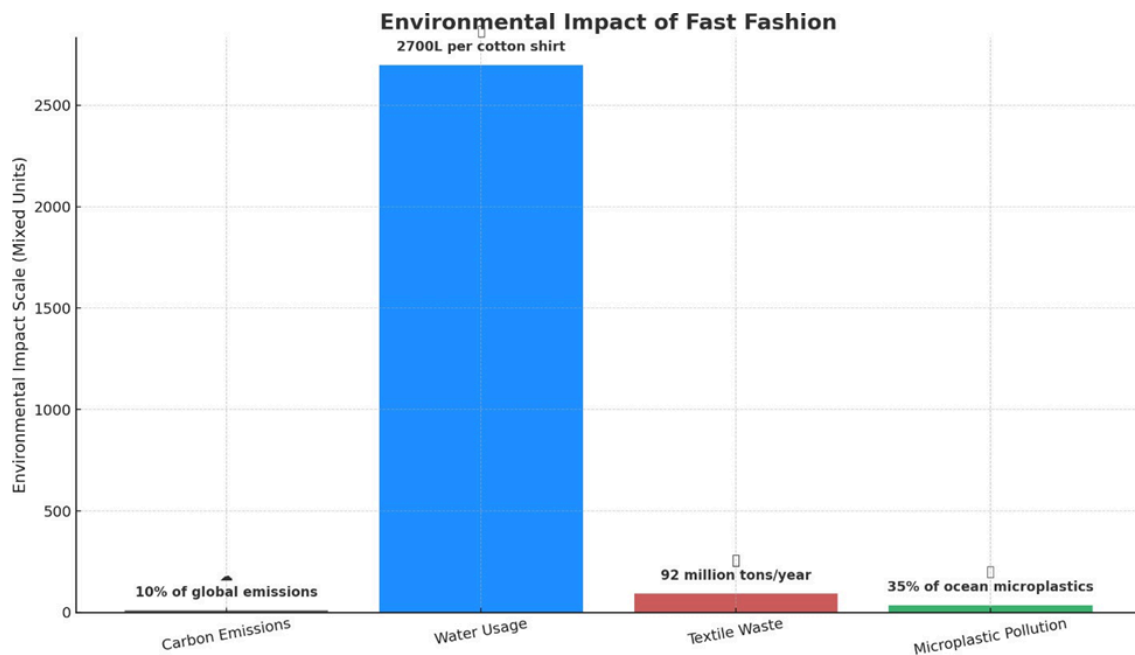

- I. Fast fashion refers to inexpensive clothing produced rapidly by mass-market retailers in response to the latest trends. This business model encourages consumers to purchase new styles frequently, often at the cost of quality and sustainability. As a result, billions of garments are discarded each year, contributing massively to global textile waste.
- II. The environmental impact of fast fashion is severe. The industry is responsible for around 10% of global carbon emissions, which is more than all international flights and maritime shipping combined. The production of clothing also consumes enormous amounts of water. For example, it takes around 2,700 liters of water to make a single cotton shirt—enough for one person to drink for two and a half years.
- III. The use of synthetic fabrics such as polyester and nylon adds to the problem. These fabrics are derived from fossil fuels and take hundreds of years to decompose. Moreover, when washed, synthetic clothes release microplastics into water bodies, threatening aquatic life and eventually entering the human food chain.

- IV. Fast fashion also raises ethical concerns. Many factories employ low-paid workers, sometimes in unsafe and exploitative conditions. To meet the demand for rapid production, garment workers often work long hours with minimal wages and little job security. Major clothing brands have faced criticism over poor labor practices in countries like Bangladesh, India, and Vietnam.
- V. As awareness grows, sustainable fashion is gaining momentum. Consumers are being encouraged to buy fewer, better-quality clothes, reuse or recycle garments, and support brands that follow ethical and eco-friendly production methods. Donating clothes, organizing clothing swaps, and choosing natural fabrics are small steps that can make a big difference.

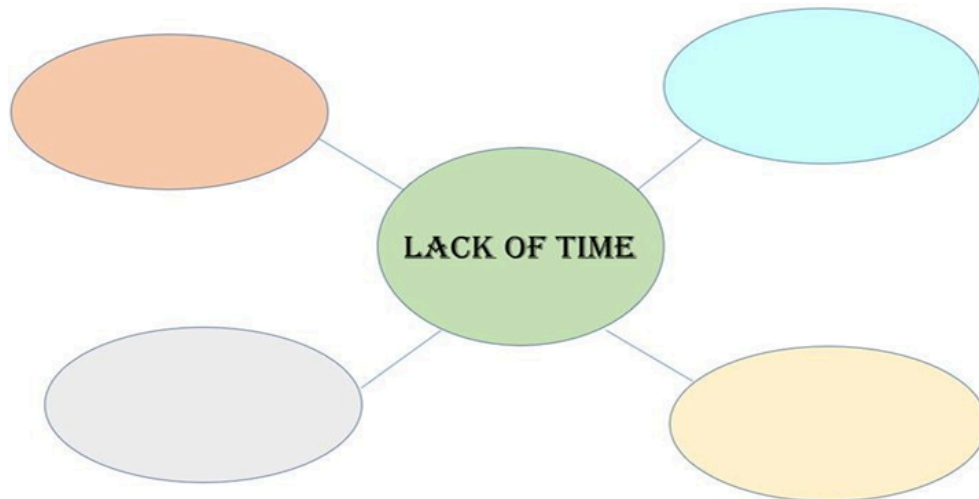
